Ten Commandments You must not give false testimony



IN:

- Was there anything in the video (or on Sunday) that particularly struck you? What was helpful? What was challenging?
- What is your experience of the phrase –
 'Stick and stones may break my bones, but
 words can never hurt me'
- Can you think of examples of 'selective truths' which you have seen or experienced
- What effect can lying and deceit have on us, and those around us?

UP:

- What does the Bible say about truth in relation to God, Jesus and the people of God?
- How is satan characterized in the Bible in regard to the truth
- How do we seek to discern the truth in our lives?
- What does the Bible say about the truths of who we are in Christ?
- What tempts us to lie?
- How can we promote truth in our own lives and the lives of others?
- What does it mean to 'speak the truth in love' (Ephesians 4.15)?

OUT:

- Pray through some of the issues or situations raised where we feel we may be tempted to lie
- Where do we see challenges to truth in our daily lives – encourage people to be open and vulnerable, honest and real and then offer to pray for one another
- Try to identify at least one tangible step you could take to increasingly promote truth in your life eg. consider entering into a greater level of accountability with someone.
